SFLBC Reservation System

Access to SFLBC Clubhouse

Every member creates a 6-digit number that can be used to enter both the east and west side of the Clubhouse. **See Contact List.**

Bowling Options¹

A variety of bowling options are available to each member. The **SFLBC Reservation System** is your next best friend: <https://tinyurl.com/y5numsoc> All events are free unless stated.

Each member receives a chip with their name that hangs on the member board inside the Clubhouse. Place the chip on the table to join social games and the Monthly Social Bowl.

Club Social Bowling: Tuesdays and Thursdays - 10:00 AM (chip by 9:45), 12:30 PM (chip by 12:15)

Monthly Social Bowl: On the 2nd Thursday of the month, members join for an informal draw tournament, with the same times as Social Bowl. There are snacks and prize money. Entry fees apply.

Sunday Bowling: 10 AM with coach (many Sundays)

Tournaments: 1/2 day recreational, All-day tournaments + PIMD (Pacific InterMountain Division: 12 member clubs!). Entry fees apply.

Private Bowling and Practice: The green is available from 10:00 AM to dusk, 6 days a week. Wednesdays from 2:00 PM until dusk, and sometimes for night bowling.

Bowls Use, Equipment & Locker Access

SFLBC maintains an inventory of used bowls that members can check out for personal use. The bowls must be returned after your bowling session.

If you are interested in purchasing a used set of bowls, **see the Contact List.**

Each member is expected to have personal equipment such as a measure, chalk, and grip aids. Jacks are available in the equipment sheds. Contact SFLBCmerch@gmail.com to purchase accessories.

Once you own a set of bowls, you may request a locker. Lockers are shared. **See Contact List.**

Communication

Every member will receive general SFLBC emails. SFLBC offers an optional group email for club-related communication, including event invitations, advice, and requests for help. Expressions of political and religious content are not appropriate for this forum.

Games and Practice

Setting up the rink the first time can be daunting, so showing up for Club Social Bowl (a.k.a. Chip Game) is the best way to learn the ropes.

A checklist for set-up:

- Direction Board: See the Clubhouse display
- Equipment Shed Key: Located inside the east side of the Clubhouse
- Bird Nets: Must be pulled back and replaced after play
- Return all rink equipment and lock sheds
- Large green mats: To be used whenever the greens are more vulnerable to damage (during rain or when the greens are soft and prone to divots).
- IMPORTANT: Return the key to the Clubhouse

Guest Policy

A member may invite up to 2 guests (12 & older) after completing 3 bowling sessions and demonstrating sufficient experience with SFLBC procedures.

A 3-visit limit per guest is permitted; after that, they must either join the member track or pay a \$10 daily drop-in fee (Venmo, Zelle, or cash).

A member and guest must be signed in on the online [SFLBC Reservation Sheet](#) prior to play.

All guests must sign a Release of Liability waiver, and large green mats must be used during the bowling session.

Finished for the Day

Turn off the lights • Spread the nets • Close and lock the doors, windows, gates, and sheds

BOWL ON THE FOREHAND
Extend your left arm to the side (if bowler is righthanded).



HAVE YOUR BOWL STOP HERE
Put your foot where you want the bowl to finish and point to it.



BOWL ON THE BACKHAND
Extend your right arm to the side (if bowler is righthanded).



BOWLS ARE TOUCHING
Touch knuckles together.



THIS IS OUR BOWL
Point closely to the bowl and tap your shoulder or chest.



WHERE IS THE JACK?
Bending down, hold your palm forward.



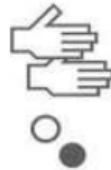
THIS IS THEIR BOWL
Point closely to the bowl and wave your arm away.



THE SHOT IS A MEASURE
Wave hands apart, together, apart as if measuring.



SHOTS FOR US
Tap your shoulder or head.



THE BOWL IS THIS FAR IN FRONT OR BEHIND OF THE JACK
Spread your hands one above the other. **NOTE: Always give the DEPTH distance not the WIDTH.**



SHOTS AGAINST US
Tap your leg.



WATCH THE HEAD
Before throwing a "runner," simulate a fast delivery with your bowling arm.



CHALK MY TOUCHER
Cross your hands at your wrist and hold them in front of you.

Lawn Bowls Hand Signals

LET YOUR HANDS TO DO THE TALKING

1. Voices cannot be heard over the sounds of road and air traffic.
2. Shouting disturbs players on the rinks.
3. Your team will feel more in sync if you can read each others signals.
4. Signals will help communication and the flow of the game.
5. You can signal without drawing attention of your oppents to certain situations.

RULE NUMBER 1:

You can ONLY communicate with your team when you have possession of the mat.

RULE NUMBER 2:

Give information (especially the Vice) ONLY when asked for.



The Etiquette of Lawn Bowling²

The sport of lawn bowling is conducted in an atmosphere of fellowship and sociability. The following are not the rules of the game, they are common acts of courtesy—the unwritten rules of the sport.

General Courtesies

- Pay quiet attention when pregame announcements are being made.
- Listen attentively when names are being called for the draw of a game.
- Move promptly to your assigned rink and greet your opponents and teammates.
- Wear your name badge for easy identification.
- Be sure your bowls bag is moved as far back as possible on the bank. Please do not leave it on a bench after you've removed your bowls.
- Fist bump or shake your opponents' and teammates' hands and wish them a good game.
- Be ready to play promptly at the beginning of the game and on each subsequent end.
- Stand 4–6 feet behind the mat and don't talk or move about when your opponent is on the mat and about to deliver the jack or a bowl.
- Remember, a player has full possession of the mat until a delivered bowl comes to rest.
- Following a delivered bowl down the rink should be avoided. It's not against the rules, but it can be a distraction for players on adjoining rinks.
- The Skip should always be at the head.
- Never be critical of the play of your opponents or teammates.
- Do not use profanities.
- Don't forget the customary fistbumps/handshakes at the end of the game.

Team Roles

The first objective of the game is to have FUN, then compete. There's always tomorrow, no one's perfect, and everyone improves. The best stories come from losing 20 to 3 (ouch!). Note: In a Pairs Game, the roles of Lead and Vice are combined.

Lead

- The Skips will flip a coin at the outset of a game to see who gets the mat (goes first).
- Center the mat on the rink's centerline.
- Try to deliver the jack to the spot indicated by your Skip.
- Play each bowl as directed by your Skip; if in doubt, ask.
- Retire promptly to the bank when your last bowl comes to rest.
- Stand behind the Vice when at the head end of the rink.

Vice (In a Triples Game)

- Mark touchers (a bowl that hits the jack) with chalk.
- Be prepared to measure the distance between the opponent's and your team's bowls and the jack if there's a question of who has the point.
- Help your opponent measure when necessary.
- Only direct play when asked by the Skip.
- Use hand signals to communicate to the Skip the points won or lost in each end.
- When the end is completed, hand the jack to the Lead who has the mat on the next end.

Skip

- As the team leader, the Skip's job is to encourage, help, and provide POSITIVE direction ALWAYS.
- Helpful play includes: showing the line, reporting the distance of a bowl, showing the Lead and Vice where to bowl.
- Assess a new member's learning style and refrain from overcoaching.
- The Skip's decision is final.

Carefully Observe the Following

- Don't walk up the rink until all players are ready to move.
- Don't walk on adjoining rinks.
- If you're at the head end of the rink, stand at least 6 feet behind the jack (exceptions: the Skip or Vice having possession of the mat).
- Avoid having your shadow obscure the jack.
- Do not move at the head end of the rink when a player is on the mat and about to deliver a bowl.
- Help keep the game moving by kicking in bowls when an end is completed.
- Keep negative opinions of the quality of a green to yourself—they won't improve it.
- Follow SFLBC rules regarding proper dress: white when required or suggested, otherwise casual clothing.
